REIMAGINING THE DUAL-CONSOLE

The Grady-White 415 Freedom is a high-performing dayboat with a multifunctional layout and broad appeal.

Grady-White's Freedom 415 is a supersize and versatile dual-console with the builder's proven SeaV2® hull form, a continuously variable-deadrise shape that cleaves chop, ensuring a soft ride and optimizing the performance of its outboard power with standard quad 450 hp Yamaha engines.

With a hand-laid fiberglass hull and deck, the Freedom 415 has stout construction too. This dual-console's multifunction design stretches above and below the deck, as well as from stem to stern.

Grady-White's renowned fishing focus is apparent in the cockpit, which is outfitted with a digitally controlled transom refrigerator/freezer box. There are twin dual raw-water livewells for live-bait fans, and the wet bar does double duty as a bait-prep station. There's an array of rod holders in the gunwales, as well as four standard rocket launchers, with two mounted on each hard-top leg. Finish off the must-have fishing features with 22-foot outriggers.

The Freedom 415 is also a family-friendly dayboat with upscale flour-ishes. There is the Dekton sintered-stone counter surface. Slide away the bait-prep station countertop to reveal a grill. The wet bar has a sink as well as refrigerator drawers and cleverly concealed drinkware stowage.

Mezzanine seating to starboard and flip-up seating at the transom

create a conversation space. The bridge deck offers even more entertainment room, with a dinette to port with two high-gloss wood tables that fold out. The outboard table lowers electrically—add a filler cushion to create U-shaped seating. Across are two helm chairs with a sleek dash accented with all-black upholstery. The console accommodates twin 19- or 22-inch multifunction displays. A digital-switching system on the displays makes it easy to control onboard systems, while wraparound glass ensures an element-free climate-controlled experience.

The Freedom 415's foredeck has lounge seating with lumbar backrests and high/low teak tables. Drop the tables and add cushions to form sun pads. Four carbon-fiber poles connect a bow shade to dial back the heat.

There are accommodations belowdecks to port for an escape from the sun or for overnighting. A head with a shower is to starboard.

This dual console is also technology-filled: From its remote-engine flush system to the standard Seakeeper 6 gyrostabilizer, the list is long.

The Freedom 415 takes the culmination of Grady-White's boatbuilding know-how and adds in an armada of new, luxe features to create a dashing dayboat that does it all—plus a good bit more.
